### **Respect**

- Careful choice of language
- Personal space and property – yours and mine! (*Please don't touch anything on my desk!*)
- Cell phones – use them at lunch, not in my room

### **Responsibility**

## Grading Policies:

### Absent Work

## Social Studies Zeroes Are not Permitted

The purpose of homework is for you to practice what you have learned before you are tested on the same information. When you do not do the homework, you are less prepared for a test or project.

If you come to class and do not have your homework completed, you will be SS-ZAPPED. This means you get a chance to make up some points.

### SS-ZAP Policies:

1. All late work starts at 50%.
2. On every Friday at 3:10 pm that week's late work is due for a maximum of 50%. Failure to meet this deadline means you're SS-ZAPPED.
3. Students who have not turned in missing assignments will be SS-ZAPPED on Monday morning.
